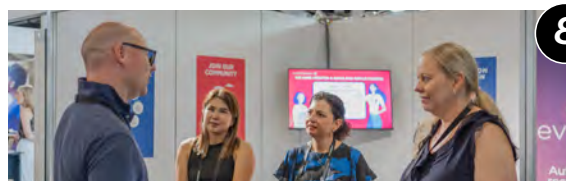

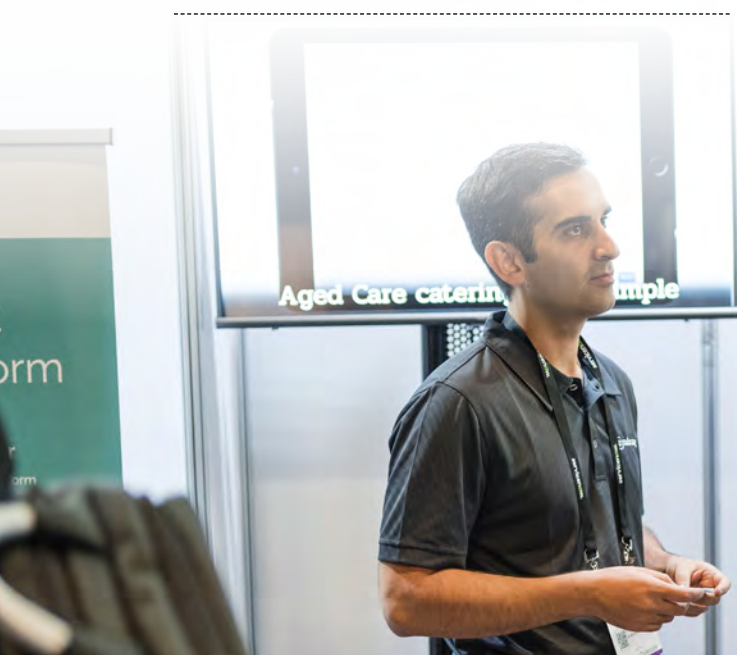

## Implementing a ward-level behaviour change intervention to improve nursing handover practices at St Vincent's Public Hospitals

This presentation will see Joanne Taylor and Professor Diana Slade talk to contextualised interventions, informed by linguistic analysis, that were developed to improve the effectiveness of nursing handover on 7 wards across three Public Hospitals between 2019-2022.

Poor communication is one of the top contributors to clinical incidents in healthcare. Nursing clinical handovers are fundamental to continuity of patient care and patient safety, and if conducted skilfully at the patient's bedside, provide an opportunity to involve patients in their care. Joanne and Diana will discuss how they:

- collected and analysed handover language and contextual data
- translated findings into communication protocols, training and recommendations for ward level changes
- improved nursing handover practices and an associated reduction in clinical incidents.

Soon rectal cancer, bariatric and other general surgical speciality areas will get on-board too. The benefits include:

- Proactive communication and engagement
- Better triaging, flow and prioritization of waitlist
- Improved health literacy
- Setting clear shared expectations between consumers and providers
- Improved wholistic wellbeing in patients
- Improved surgical outcomes for patients
- Reduced waiting time for patients

## Entering the Testy Waters of PROMs: How Health New Zealand Is Bringing Equity and Social Dimensions at the Centre of Elective Surgery Prioritization

PROMs use cases are rare to come by and with good reason – the complexity of sifting through qualitative insight around a patient's perception of their health and needs and linking it to healthcare decisions is clear. That said, Prioritising patients for elective surgery remains one of the biggest challenges of health systems around the world and Christopher McEwan has set out to address this problem for the NZ Health system – and from his experience, this ambitious undertaking has brought to light ground-breaking implications to how we leverage patient insight and PROMs to make decisions that are in favour of consumers and not the health system. In this talk he will share insights around:

## Overcoming Barriers with Harnessing Value from Clinical Quality Registries to Drive Quality Improvements For Patients

Clinical quality registries (CQRs) systematically collect data on pre-agreed markers of quality of care for a given procedure, that can be reliably and reproducibly defined and collected across multiple sites. That said, the value remains untapped due to barriers such as difficulty of accurate data capture, lack of a fit for purpose ethical review system, the constraints of existing Qualified Privilege legislations and the need for protected funding. Susannah will share her efforts with health services to overcome these challenges and develop analytics, benchmark-driven governance & improvements in care.

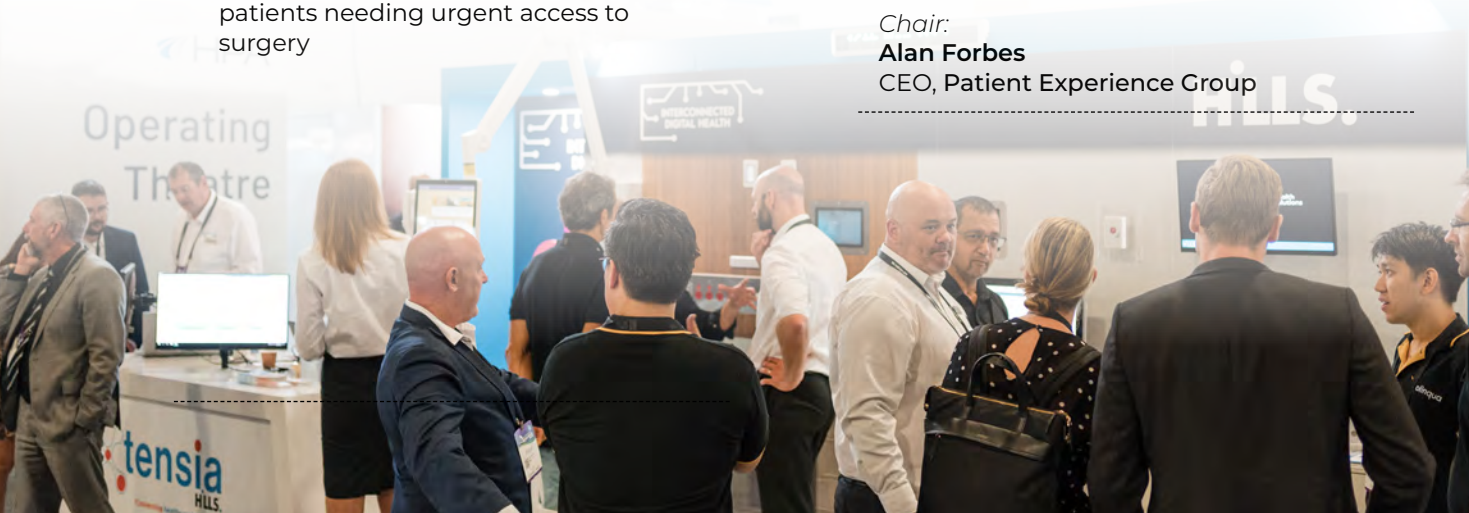
